

Nomination - Supply Chain Canada Fellow Designation

The Supply Chain Canada Fellow Designation (FSCMP) is the highest honour bestowed by Supply Chain Canada and will be presented to a Supply Chain Canada member, who holds the SCMP designation, and who has made contributions to the supply chain industry, the profession, the association and their community over the course of time.

FSCMPs have demonstrated excellence in supply chain management, commitment to and pride in supply chain, and a civic mindedness which brings a community's respect to the member and, through the member, to the supply chain management profession.

Admittance to this Fellowship recognizes an individual who has rendered conspicuous service to the association, enhanced the supply chain management profession through their efforts or has made a genuine contribution of new knowledge to the field.

Fellows are visionary leaders and contributors – to the industry, the profession and the community at large.

Any SCMP member demonstrating supply chain leadership is eligible to be nominated for this award. Nominations may be put forward by Supply Chain Canada members or Institutes. Self-nominations will not be accepted.
